Never did the adventurous spirit of Elizabethan seafarers find a nobler expression than in this stirring work.

The persistent beat of Drake's drum is heard throughout in the orchestral accompaniment as the great sea captain "sleeping down below", "and dreaming all the time of Plymouth Hoe", is waiting to face the Dons and "drum them up the Channel as we drummed them long ago".

"Outward Bound" is a sad song of farewell as the sailor puts out to sea and sings:

"O Mother, must we bid farewell to thee?  
With love remember yet

The sons in exile on the eternal sea."

"Devon, O Devon in Wind and Rain" is a challenging cry of victory as:

"Drake in the North Sea grimly prowling

Treading his ~~dear~~ Revenge's deck,

Watch'd with the sea-dogs round him growling,

Galleons drifting wreck by wreck."

In a memorable passage "Call to the storm and drive them flying" the chorus comes lashing in like the wind and rain.

In "Homeward Bound", the tall ship in calm waters is heading for home

"On smooth and shining tides

Swiftly the great ship glides."

The "Old Superb" is now one of the great sea songs of England with its rollicking chorus:

"So Westward Ho! for Trinidad, and Eastward Ho! for Spain,  
And 'Ship Ahoy!' a hundred times a day."
